THE BUFFALO TRAILS BOARD

SEC. 2B-1. PURPOSE.

It is hereby declared and determined that an advisory Board is necessary to develop and maintain a comprehensive plan for the maintenance and development of the City of Buffalo's Clear Creek Trail System in order to provide a public non-motorized transportation network, to enhance recreation, dedicate fiscally responsible open space and value historical resources for the City of Buffalo, and to maintain, improve, and redevelop aesthetic values attributable to existing and future multi-use trails in the City's Master Trails Plan. (Ord. 1073, §1. 6/89) (R.O. 1278. § 4. 17/07;R.O. 1309, 11, 4/2008)

SEC. 2B-2. DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of the section, the following words and terms, whenever used or referred to in this section, shall have the following respective meanings unless different meanings clearly appear from the context::

A) Board shall mean the Buffalo Trails Board created pursuant to the provisions of this section and said Board shall be legally designated the Buffalo Trails Board.

B) The Buffalo Trails Board shall be authorized to work on trails-related issues within the City limits of the City of Buffalo, City property, and in cooperation with state and federal agencies on public lands. The Buffalo Trails Board shall mean the interest in land or properties consisting of officially recognized segments of the City's Clear Creek Trail System, and will include such structures, facilities and improvements necessary and convenient for the development and maintenance of the said trail system and for the promotion and development of scenic and aesthetic qualities, transportation, commerce and recreational opportunities afforded by the Clear Creek Trail System of Buffalo. C) Council shall mean the City Councilpersons for the City of Buffalo.

D) Mayor shall mean the Mayor of the City of Buffalo.

E) Persons shall mean any individual, combination of individuals, partnerships or corporations.

SEC. 2B-3. APPOINTMENT OF BOARD.

The Mayor of the City of Buffalo, with the advise and consent of the City Council, shall appoint the Buffalo Trail Board consisting of at least three (3) and not more than nine (9) members. The members appointed to serve on said Commission shall be persons owning title to real property or residing within the City of Buffalo, Wyoming; with exception of one (1) board member to be appointed at the discretion of the County Commissioners. The term for the appointment of each member shall be four (4) years.

Term of office shall be from January 1st to December 31st of said year or years. The Commission shall meet at least quarterly in accordance with any of the requirements of State of Wyoming law. Any Board member may be removed from office by the Mayor. Board members shall receive no salary. All terms shall be staggered in accordance with the initial appointment. SEC. 2B-4. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES.

The Board is hereby vested with the power to adopt rules for its own organization and manner in which the business of the Board shall be conducted. The Board shall initially appoint a chairperson, vice-chairperson and a secretary of the Board.

The Board shall have such further powers necessary to accomplish the purpose of this section, including, but not limited to, the following:

A) The Board may conduct fact-finding and informational hearings as may be prescribed by its rules and make proposals to the governing body of the City of Buffalo that will meet its purpose and the purposes for which the Commission is engaged.

B) The Board shall prepare and propose a plan of development for public facilities and other improvements to public and private property, including site preparation, and construction which may be necessary or appropriate to the execution of any development plan which, in the opinion of the Board, will aid and improve the Clear Creek Trail System.

C) The Board shall investigate, compile and recommend applications to proper federal, state and county offices or agencies or to any other source for grants, guarantees, or other financial assistance in the aid of the operation, maintenance, construction, and development of the Buffalo Master Trail's Plan.

D) The Board may make investigation studies and recommendations to the governing body of the City of Buffalo for the growth, modification, and development of said Clear Creek trail System which will enable the City of Buffalo to meet the purposes as defined herein.

E) In cooperation with City Boards, Boards that include City appointees and community organizations develop long-range plans designed to carry out the plans of the Board and to promote the purposes herein declared, and implement education and public relations to fully implement such plans.

F) Trail System Maintenance: The Board shall fulfill maintenance duties as outlined in the current Master Trails Plan regarding the safety and appearance of the trail system and shall coordinate with the City Public Works Department.

G) Budget: The Board shall prepare and submit on or before the first day of March of each year to the governing body a proposed budget for the ensuing fiscal year. Said budget shall be subject to alteration, modification or revision by the governing body and after being approved by them, shall be adopted as a fiscal plan for the Board for the ensuing year. Any expenditures by the Board must meet all the requirements of the rules and regulations concerning purchasing as adopted by the purchasing policy of the governing body of the City of Buffalo.

SEC. 2B-5. CONSTRUCTION.

The provisions of this section shall be liberally construed and interpreted to effect the declared purposes as set forth herein. (Ord. 1053, 2/87; R.O. 1309, 11, 4/2008)

CHAPTER 2C

MAIN STREET DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION

SEC. 2C-1. PURPOSE.

It is hereby declared and determined that an advisory Commission is necessary to develop and maintain a comprehensive plan for the redevelopment and development of the Main Street and central business areas through the City of Buffalo to restore or promote the health, safety, prosperity, security and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Buffalo, and to preserve, improve, and redevelop aesthetic and cultural values attributable to the Main Streets of the City of Buffalo.

SEC. 2C-2. DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of the section, the following words and terms, whenever used or referred to in this section, shall have the following respective meanings unless different meanings clearly appear from the context:

A) Commission shall mean the Main Street Development Commission created pursuant to the provisions of this section and said Commission shall be legally designated the Main Street Development Commission.

B) Main Street shall mean the interest in land or properties consisting of the streets, sidewalks, alleys and right-of-ways along or adjoining the Main Street of the City of Buffalo, including Hart Street (U.S. Highway 16) and Fort Street within the boundaries of the City of Buffalo, and will include such structures, facilities and improvements necessary and convenient for the development and maintenance of Main Street and for the promotion and development of scenic and aesthetic qualities, commerce and cultural opportunities afforded by Main Street.

C) Council shall mean the City Councilpersons for the City of Buffalo.

D) Mayor shall mean the Mayor of the City of Buffalo.

E) Persons shall mean any individual, combination of individuals, partnerships or corporations.

SEC. 2C-3. APPOINTMENT OF COMMISSION.

The Mayor of the City of Buffalo, with the advice and consent of the City Council, shall appoint the Main Street Commission consisting of three (3) members. The members appointed to serve on said Commission shall be persons owning title to real property or residing within the City of Buffalo, Wyoming, or within the zoning jurisdiction of the Buffalo City Planning Commission. The term for the appointment of each member shall be four (4) years and the Mayor shall initially appoint one (1) member for a term of three (3) years, one (1) member for a term of two (2) years, and one (1) member for a term of one (1) year. Thereafter, all members shall serve for the full four (4) year term. Term of office shall be from January 1st to December 31st of said year or years. The Commission shall meet at least quarterly in accordance with any of the requirements of State of Wyoming law. Any Commission member may be removed from office by the Mayor. Commission members shall receive no salary.(R.O. 1335, 10, 6/2009)

SEC. 2C-4. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES.

The Commission is hereby vested with the power to adopt rules for its own organization and manner in which the business of the Commission shall be conducted. The Commission shall initially appoint a chairman and secretary of the Commission.

The Commission shall have such further powers necessary to accomplish the purpose of this section, including, but not limited to, the following:

A) The Commission may conduct fact-finding and informational hearings as may be prescribed by its rules and make proposals to the governing body of the City of Buffalo that will meet its purpose and the purposes for which this Commission is engaged.

B) The Commission shall prepare and propose a plan of development for public facilities and other improvements to public and private property, including site preparation, and construction which may be necessary or appropriate to the execution of any development plan which, in the opinion of the Commission, will aid and improve Main Street.

C) The Commission shall investigate and recommend applications to proper federal, state and county offices or agencies or to any other source for grants, guarantees, or other financial assistance in the aid of the operation, maintenance, construction, and development of the Main Street Development plan.

D) The Commission may make investigation studies and recommendations to the governing body of the City of Buffalo for the growth, modification, and development of said Main Street which will enable the City of Buffalo to meet the purposes as defined herein.

E) In cooperation with the Clear Creek Development and the City Planning Commissions, develop long-range plans designed to carry out the plans of the Commission and to promote the purposes herein declared, and implement education and public relations to fully implement such plans.

F) Budget: The Commission shall submit on or before the first day of March of each year to the governing body a proposed budget for the ensuing fiscal year. Said budget shall be subject to alteration, modification or revision by the governing body and after being approved by them, shall be adopted as a fiscal plan for the Commission for the ensuing year. Any expenditures by the Commission must meet all the requirements of the rules and regulations concerning purchasing as adopted by the purchasing policy of the governing body of the City of Buffalo.

SEC. 2C-5. CONSTRUCTION.

The provisions of this section shall be liberally construed and interpreted to effect the declared purposes as set forth herein.

CHAPTER 2D

BUFFALO PARKS BOARD

§ 2D-1 Buffalo Parks Board
§ 2D-2 Powers of the Board

SEC. 2D-1. BUFFALO PARKS BOARD.

There is hereby created and established a parks board to be known as the Buffalo Parks Board which will consist of five (5) members holding title to real property or residing in the City of Buffalo, Wyoming, to be appointed by the Mayor, by and with the consent of the City Council. Such member shall serve without pay. Term for appointment of each member shall be two (2) years and the city Council shall initially appoint two (2) members for a term of two (2) years and three (3) members for a term of one (1) year. Thereafter, all members shall serve for the full two-year term. Term of office shall be from January 1st until December 31st of said year or years. Any vacancies on such board, whether by death, removal from office, resignation or otherwise, shall be filled by appointment by the Mayor as hereinabove provided. SEC. 2D-2 POWERS OF THE BOARD.

The Buffalo Parks Board shall have the power to direct the general operation, maintenance, control and adornment and development of the Buffalo municipal parks. All expenditures from such funds shall be approved by the chairman of the Buffalo Parks Board provided that nothing shall be construed as preventing the Council from making appropriations for or paying accounts for park expenditures from the general funds of the City of Buffalo to purchase equipment, material and property for use of the parks; to contract for and direct operation expenses in the parks. The Buffalo Parks Board has the authority to elect a president or chairman and to hold meetings and to keep a record of such meetings, and to make and publish any and all rules and regulations for the management, maintenance and enjoyment of the parks and in their discretion they deem necessary, which rules and regulations may be enforced by excluding violators thereof from the use and benefit of the parks and to do and perform all other acts and other things consistent with the proper and efficient management, control and development of the parks. The board shall submit on or before the first day of March of each year to the Mayor and City Council a proposed budget for the ensuing fiscal year. Said budget shall be subject to alterations, modification or revision by the City Council and after being approved by them shall be adopted as the fiscal plan for the board for the ensuing year. All purchases under the budget shall be in accordance with the purchasing policy of the City of Buffalo. (Ord. 1052 , ' 4, 2/87; R.O. 1336, ' 9, 15/09)
